

MEETING SUMMARY
July 11, 2017
Suffolk County EMS Office, Yaphank, New York 11980

NOTE: This summary is a draft summary until formally approved at the September 12, 2017 meeting.

- Meeting called to order by Vice-Chairman Philip Cammann at 7:00 PM followed by the salute to the flag and a moment of silence for all those serving in the military and those departed from our service, and especially Greg Williams, Rod Costa and Corey Moore from the RB Lawrence Ambulance Service in the Syracuse area, in the North Country Region, each of whom died in the line of duty on July 5th.
- Vice-Chairman Cammann introduced special guests in the room: Suffolk County Health Commissioner Dr. James Tomarken; NY State EMS and Trauma Systems Director Lee Burns; and NY State EMS and Trauma Systems Sr. EMS Representative Brian Sherwood.
- Vice-Chairman Cammann then called all REMSCO Past Chairs in attendance to the front of the room to assist in presenting the Chief Thomas E. Lateulere Lifetime Achievement Award to Bob Delagi, for his contributions to EMS and Public Safety in the Suffolk Region. The full text of Mr. Cammann's remarks, in tribute to Chief Tom Lateulere, and the development of the award, provided as [attachment 2](#).
- Presentation of "CPR Save" award to the crew from the Patchogue Ambulance Service for their role in saving a life. Mr. Delagi noted that the initiation of this particular lifesaving award originated with the Suffolk County Police Department, not present tonight, who document the use of their AED with high quality CPR, converting the rhythm from coarse ventricular fibrillation to a sinus rhythm, demonstrating the value of rapid defibrillation through first responders such as the police, as the impetus of the program that began in the early 1990's.
- Vice-Chairman Camman called for a motion to approve the May 9th meeting summary as distributed, motion made, seconded and passed.

End of July, 2017 Correspondence

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Education & Training – Mike Masterton / Dr. Pigott

- Mr. Masterton announced that there will be a Regional Instructor Update on September 15 and September 22. Information will be distributed through the website.
- The EMS Division will be hosting two (2) separate EMT-CC Course Informational Sessions in August, dates to be determined and distributed through the website.

Communications & Technology – Vacant

- No report at this time, Mr. Talmage and Mr. Pellicone deferred to the Performance Improvement Committee Report.

Nominations Committee – H. Rosenblum

- On behalf of the committee, Ms. Rosenblum brought forth a seconded motion to elect Philip Cammann to the position of Chair. Motion carried unanimously.
- On behalf of the committee, Ms. Rosenblum brought forth a seconded motion to elect Anthony Pellicone to the position of Vice-Chair. Motion carried unanimously.
- Ms. Rosenblum reported that she, Mrs. McCormack, and Mr. Boyd conducted telephone interviews with Mr. Joseph Cutrone and Mr. Joseph Micheels in effort to fill the Commercial Ambulance Services Sector representative. It was noted that while both candidates were well informed and had exemplary resumes, the committee brought forth a seconded motion that Mr. Micheels be elected to fill the vacancy. Motion carried unanimously. Discussion continued that while bylaws do not allow the REMSCO to choose an alternate to represent a constituency, it was the sense of the REMSCO that Mr. Cutrone serve as Mr. Micheels' alternate.
- Ms. Rosenblum concluded the committee's report by stating that she had received an inquiry from Tom Cronogue regarding the vacancy created by Suffolk FRES's departure as a represented constituency, indicating that the Suffolk County Volunteer Firefighters Burn Center be extended an invitation to join the council. The committee will take this under advisement and report back at the next meeting.

Legislative – R. Franz

- Mr. Franz reported that there are several one-house bills with EMS System implications currently under watch. No action to take at this time.

PIO – E. Komosinski

- Mrs. Komosinski reported that the 2016 Annual REMSCO Awards Ceremony and Dinner, co-hosted with the Commack Volunteer Ambulance Corps., will be held on Thursday September 14th, at 7:00 PM. This year's theme "Evening Under the Stars," will be held at Commack Fire Department Headquarters.

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REMAC –

- Mr. Cammann reported that due to a scheduling conflict, Dr. Minnerop was unable to attend. He sent along a message that the REMAC was working with the EMS Division on an alternative medication advice for the EMS System. Mr. Delagi stated that the National Pharmaceutical Shortage has been ongoing since 2010, and our efforts will likely follow what we have done in the past regarding alternative medication preparations. The REMAC was actually working on an email vote on a past-practice proposal, and to expect advice and options to be distributed soon. Mr. Delagi also stated that it was important that agencies clearly document all efforts to obtain medications so that if a medication that is indicated, but not available to be administered, can be supported.

Performance Improvement – A. Pellicone / B. Talmage

Resource Needs – E. Boyd

- Mr. Boyd stated nothing to report.

DELEGATES REPORT – R. Delagi

- Mr. Delagi summarized salient points from the May 7-10 Program Agency Directors / SEMSCO / SEMAC Report, provided as [attachment 3](#).

EMS DIVISION STAFF REPORT – R. Delagi, Dr. Pigott, Mike Masterton

- Mr. Delagi advised the council that the NY State DOH’s Health Emergency Preparedness Coalition (HEPC), a group representative of several facets of the statewide and regional health care systems, respectively, have now incorporated EMS as a key stakeholder. More information to follow as goals and objectives are identified.
- Mr. Delagi continued his report by advising the council of several new initiatives currently underway:
 - The partnership with University Hospital to survey EMS providers about their knowledge, understanding, and appreciation of peer review journals and the impact of published research and data on prehospital care; and
 - an academic research partnership with University Hospital focused on prehospital identification of patients with stroke-like signs/symptoms linked to Large Vessel Occlusion (LVO) and endovascular therapy as a more effective alternative than thrombolytic therapy.
- Mr. Masterton reported that he and Dr. Pigott developed a working committee of Stroke Center Coordinators, much like was recently done with STEMI Coordinators. One of the goals is to make available to EMS providers a standardized QI follow-up tool for to stroke patients.

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Old Business

- Mr. Talmage reported on the recent meeting of the ePCR Committee, held on July 6th. The committee seeks to standardize required regional data points, as a guide for agencies seeking to transition to electronic recordkeeping, to ensure that the respective vendors/products are all providing the same information. Mr. Pellicone added that the goal is to ensure that the regional data points are useful to the REMSCO, REMAC, Program, Agency and the EMS Medical Director. Some discussion took place regarding how data elements are recorded, and what the NY State Data Bridge, ImageTrend, can provide. Mr. Delagi stated that all vendors with products in service in Suffolk County, are compatible with the NEMSIS data base, but it was still unclear what local data can be culled from ImageTrend. He asked that, rather than speculate on what is, what is not available, further discussion be postponed as the EMS Division staff had a conference call scheduled on July 13th with the NY State Data Bridge Manager, to learn what Image Trend has to offer, and what data elements could be retrieved in regionally available reporting formats. Mr. Delagi stated that he would provide a list of all products in use in Suffolk County and will provide a comprehensive report to Mr. Pellicone and Mr. Talmage after the conference call. (*Editor's Note: this was provided in an email on July 13th*).
- Mr. Talmage announced that the next meeting of the committee has been scheduled for July 20th at the EMS Office.

New Business

- Mr. Cammann reported that he was contacted by the Chief of the Southampton Ambulance Corps, inquiring if the REMSCO has an Award for Valor system in place. Recently, several members of the ambulance corps exhibited bravery in the face of danger in executing a rescue of an occupant of a burning vehicle, secondary to a motor vehicle crash, prior to the arrival of the fire department. REMSCO does not have such an award, however, Ms. Montrose commented that FASNY does give out an EMS Provider of the Year award for actions such as this. Mr. Talmage stated that he would discuss with the Suffolk County Ambulance Chief's Association to see if they have a process. Mr. Dackow suggested that this Award for Valor could be added to the categories REMSCO manages on an annual basis. Mr. Delagi suggested that the REMSCO convene a TAG to determine criteria for such an award, taken under advisement.
- Mrs. McCormack reached out to REMSCO members for assistance regarding ensuring that trauma patients get to the correct hospital and that prenotification reports are given to the trauma center as soon as feasible after the patient assessment is completed and even before transport. She referred to the work that the RTAC, in partnership with the EMS Division, recently completed, with a goal that focuses on a 15 minute prenotification to the trauma center, MVIT criteria, and 30-second time out at bedside for EMS provider to give report to the trauma team. Since program rollout, the goal is widely variant between hospitals, between 0 and 22% for trauma triage box 1 and box 2 patients. Mr. Masterton reported that the EMS Division incorporated this training into all original, refresher and CME trauma-related classes, effective July 1, and hopefully this will improve as information gets out consistently. Mr. Masterton then stated that trauma centers need to continue hosting these CME classes for their respective catchment area ambulance services.
- NY State EMS and Trauma Systems Director Burns, in attendance as part of her REMSCO-tour-around-the-State, offered comments about the maturity and improvement of the trauma system in NY State since the transition to the ACS Verification Process.

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New Business - continued

Ms. Burns continued by discussing how trauma care was re-engineered across NY State and now is the time for EMS to mature in-kind to ensure the right patient gets to the right hospital, not necessarily the closest hospital. Mrs. McCormack referred to a study that was published by Southside Hospital's Trauma Chief Dr. Grossman that demonstrates a clear and convincing decrease in mortality and morbidity in trauma centers that achieve ACS verification, proving that patient outcomes are indeed linked to committed resources.

- Referring to an item in Mr. Delagi's earlier report, Ms. Burns reported that despite the Department's move to not allow "temporary certification" the numbers of providers still requesting on-site scoring remains high. She opined that it was likely due to the need for self-gratification after working so hard to complete a course, but the Department has no choice to follow the new rule, as there were too many people across the State that gained entry into a written exam without having fulfilled the required qualifications. With EMT certification cards being issued in about 7 days consistently, this does not appear to be an imposition on providers.
- Mr. Pellicone inquired about the potential for computerized testing in NY State. Ms. Burns replied that has been on the agenda for a significant amount of time and her staff is working with the State's testing vendor to pilot-test, for future use. She added that the Bureau is also looking at issuing electronic certification (in PDF format), however, there is pushback from providers who favor a wallet card.
- Ms. Burns then began discussion regarding the state's budget woes and the implications funding shortfalls have on EMS across all regions, and on Medicare/Medicaid reimbursement for ambulance work. She concluded by thanking the REMSCO, REMAC and the Program Agency staff for what they do to manage EMS in the region.

There being no further business to come before the council, the Chair called for a motion to adjourn at 8:35 PM.

Let it be known that the individuals selected represent the highest qualities to serve as a responder and leader and have been bestowed this honor and recognition as recipients of the Chief Thomas E. Lateulere Emergency Service Lifetime Achievement Award.

For his tireless efforts and lifetime devotion to improving the education of emergency responders and his countless contributions to improve the delivery of Emergency Services throughout his career.

Director Burns spoke of a NY State EMS System that is under-funded and under-recognized as an essential service. Since January 1, 2016 to May 10, 2017, a total of twenty six (26) services have surrendered their ambulance operating certificates as they could no longer sustain operations. There is a trickle down affect that negatively impacts State both EMS Operating and Aid to Localities funding streams, decreased by 25% over the last ten (10) years, of which this steadily decreasing funding stream for EMS initiatives does indeed impact work at the regional levels.

State DOH legal counsel reiterated the position that if a Controlled Substance License expires, even for short duration of 1 day), all controlled substances are to be returned to the hospital, until such time as the renewed license is received. It would be considered a federal DEA offense to have controlled substances without a license. Of note is that to date, only six (6) ALS agencies across NY State were unable to comply with the regulatory requirement.

New Form 4352 released for reporting controlled substance information to include all controlled substances and all time periods on one single form.

New policy statements 17-03 *Ketamine for PreHospital EMS Services* and 17-04 *Fentanyl for PreHospital EMS Services* have been released and can be found on the State DOH website.

State DOH reported that 50% of the 1,100 certified services across NY State have made the transition from paper PRC to electronic PCR.

Much discussion revolved around the future of the EMT-CC in NY State. State DOH is taking public comments, by email to EMSMail@health.ny.gov In summary - The number of CCs across NY State and Suffolk County is steadily declining while the number of paramedics is steadily increasing. The number of ALS calls run by CCs as the only level of ALS provider is steadily decreasing. It is only a matter of time before CCs become extinct naturally, and the cost : benefit ratio of a complete makeover is not sustainable. There are 59,000 certified providers in NY State, of those, 1,522 (2.5%) are CCs. As policy making bodies of NY State, the SEMAC and the SEMSCO must look at the totality of the issue statewide, not region by region. The following process was approved and includes: State DOH no longer approve CC original courses after January 1, 2018; State DOH no longer approve CC refresher courses or rapid refresher courses for 18 months beyond the January 1, 2018 date above; CCs in continuous practice as defined by Part 800.3 & 800.9 may continue to provide care at the CC level and refresh the CC certification indefinitely (some heard 10 years - there is an issue with establishing a time frame for this as the CME Program for CC level of care is codified in PHL); and State DOH is to create an automatic advanced standing process for CCs with ≥ 3 years of active experience, as defined by 800.3 & 800.9, to paramedic bridge program. Such a bridge program to include on-line didactic content with availability of skills and testing by local Course Sponsors. The program to be continued for a minimum of 10 years, commencing January 1, 2018.

As of September 1, 2017, the Bureau of EMS will cease sending individual instructor renewal packages and reminders to CICs and CLIs. It is the responsibility of the instructor to track and maintain his/her instructor certification status, and up to Course Sponsors to have a way to ensure renewals for their respective staff are maintained.

Continued.

Transition to NAESME-based instructor qualifications proceeds. Pass rate for CLIs is between 80-100% while the pass rate for CICs is not quite that high, but trending upwards with each test. Item analysis on test questions was again validated by the new testing vendor. To date 356 CICs and 382 CLIs have passed the test.

New vendor PSI/AMP has started with the April '17 written exam. Their work with that exam has been accepted by the Bureau, and grades will be posted to the new site 9 days after the Bureau validates scores (that may decrease in the future). You should have received emails from Andy Johnson or AMP Examination Services to register, the old ProExam “box account” will shut down on June 30th.

Effective immediately, on-site scoring sheets will no longer be considered “Temporary Certification.” Students taking the on-site exams must be informed that they may not practice at the tested level of certification until the certification card arrives in the mail. New procedures instituted by the Bureau demonstrate that cards are mailed within 12 days of score validation.

Required instructor update for the epinephrine “Check & Inject” Program have been posted on the Moodle training website, along with all relevant information for educational objectives <http://vitalsignsconference.com/server/moodle/login/index.php> To date, 150 instructors have completed the training. This information is required information in all courses, for all written exams after the August 2017 exam. This does not replace auto-injector training, it supplements it. There is no PSE Station for check & inject, and it was approved that EMT-Bs can use the same syringe as ALS Providers (1 ml / 23 g), no longer confined to the syringes developed for the program (no graduations, just an A or a P designating the volume for adults and pediatric patients. Policy Statement going through in-house review by the Bureau Staff, will be released shortly.

SEMAC Advisory 97-03 on Hyperventilation of TBI has been rescinded. Per STAC and SEMAC, ventilatory rates applicable to this subset of patients are now well documented in current clinical practice at all levels.

Previous BNE and DOH rulings regarding ketamine were reinforced. It was re-affirmed that while only EMT-Paramedics may administer ketamine, EMT-Critical Care Technicians may serve as a Controlled Substance Agent in an ALS agency using ketamine, per the Part 80 Regulation. It should be noted that while it is necessary to “prevent *access* by unauthorized individuals,” it is not necessary to have 2 separate safes or strict and costly control methods in each ALS ambulance. It is acceptable practice to simply package and track ketamine and other controlled substances separately and distinctly to prevent unauthorized *use* by EMT-CCs.

Bureau Staff reported that we can see increased requests for EMS involvement in local Health Emergency Preparedness Coalitions (HEPC) due to new requirements that EMS participate in disaster planning at the local level.

The EMS memorial will be held on May 23, 2017. There are three (3) individuals suffering Line of Duty Deaths (LODD) who will be enshrined: Larry Fuller (Hunter EMS); Norman Valle (FDNY EMS); and Stephanie B. Potter (Moir Volunteer Fire & Rescue). Please do consider participating and placing an ambulance on the plaza, it is very important to honor our own while at the same time, committing to a show of force to be witnessed by our state elected officials in furtherance of the importance of a community’s EMS system.

The BLS Stroke/CVA protocol proposed changes remain in draft form, pending further action due to the loss of a SEMAC Quorum before the protocol could be approved.

State EMS Awards Process is near complete, with applications received by NY State DOH by the May 1st deadline. The PIER Committee once again expressed disappointment that only eleven (11) of seventeen (17) regions, submitted applications, and not all of the submitting regions submitted applications for each category.

The Legislative Committee is monitoring several bills:

Passed a motion to support A03978/S252A Reimbursement Transportation Costs for Emergency Medical Care without prior approval;
A04213/S00230 Designate the Month of September of each year as National Firefighter, EMS Provider, and Law Enforcement Appreciation Month.

The Legislative Committee continues to watch the following bills as each has an impact on system operations:

A02733A / S0558 Community Paramedicine Services, which allows certified EMS providers to provide care in other than emergency settings;
A07505/S05643, Directs the Health Department and the Department of Transportation to promulgate rules for ambulance operations to address EMT fatigue liabilities;
S4384/no A companion, to allow RNs and LPNs to work alongside EMTs in ambulances without becoming certified EMS providers;
S2770 / no A companion, designating EMS as an Essential Service.

The NY State EMS Memorial will be held on May 23, 2017 at the Empire State Plaza, Albany NY.

Vital Signs Educational Conference and Trade Show will be held October 25-29, 2017 in Rochester NY.

Next SEMAC/SEMSCO meetings will be held September 26-27, 2017.

End of Delegate's Report
