

MEETING SUMMARY

November 12, 2024

Suffolk County EMS, Yaphank, NY 11980

NOTE: This summary is a draft summary until approved at the January 14, 2025, meeting.

Members Present: See attendance list, provided as **attachment 1**. Subcommittees did not meet.

Meeting opened at 1900hrs with Chairman Manzi presiding. Chairman Manzi led the group in the pledge of allegiance, followed by a moment of silence. Chairman Manzi presented AMR with a Prehospital Save Award for their heroic efforts in saving the life of their colleague. AMR Supervisor Joseph Catrone introduced his staff and told the story of the recitation.

A motion was made by Dr. Acosta, seconded by Mr. Cammann, to accept the September 10, 2024, Meeting Summary, as posted. The motion carried without opposition.

Executive Officer's Report – J. Manzi

- Chairman Manzi thanked all who attended the CPR Save Awards in October. It was well attended, and the next one will be held in May.

Vice Chairman's Report – E. Boyd

- Vice Chairman Boyd also thanked all involved with the CPR Save Awards Ceremony. He also stated that it is possible that we may be adding the next round of CPR Save Awards to the conference in April.

Budget – M. Zender

- The balance in the account is \$14,043, and he is expecting a large reimbursement check from the state for approximately \$8,000.
- Mr. Zender is working on the 2025 REMSCO Tom Lateulere Memorial EMS Conference. A tour of St. Anthony's High School is planned as a potential site for the conference. Registration should open in January for providers to register to attend the conference, to be held on April 26, 2025.

End of November 12, 2024, Correspondence

Suffolk County EMS Division Staff Reports – Dr. Winslow / P. Marra/ D. Wayrich/W.M Masterton

- Mr. Marra reported the following on Operations:
 - State inspections continue, and agency renewals need to be submitted through the portal. This includes controlled substance renewals as well. If an agency needs assistance feel, free to contact Deputy Chief Keegan or Chief Marra.
 - CISM team conducted a training on suicide awareness at the end of September; the second half of the training will be held in January. In addition, the team has received six applications for new team members they hope to process before the end of the year. Newsday will be publishing an article on the team in early December.
 - In collaboration with SCPD and OEM, the Division supported the Active Shooter Trainings in Miller Place and Rocky Point.
 - Narcan training was held at Nesconset FD which was a leave behind presentation, and Community Narcan was presented at West Babylon FD's open house.
 - In conjunction with South Shore Hospital, an E-bridge training was provided.
 - Division staff recently attended MCI Drills at BNL and Bayshore. Staff provided moulage for both drills
 - Please see IV Fluid update under *Headlines* on the website. Baxter plans to resume shipping the end of November with expectations to be up to pre-Hurricane levels by the end of the year.
- Dr Winslow reported the following:
 - The regional Program Agencies met earlier today, and the new contracts are due to be received soon.
 - The last meetings of the State Council were held on September 17 and 18 and Mike Masterton will be giving the report.
 - The next meetings of the State Council are scheduled for December 3 and 4 up in Troy.

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- The REMAC policies were updated and posted on the website two weeks ago. There are no major changes other than to remove a lot of the educational materials and to reorganize the regional policies. The Advanced EMT was authorized by the REMAC to serve in Suffolk County, and there were some updates to the RMA policy to be in accordance with the RMA Collaborative protocol. A major project for 2025 will be for the REMAC to review and make updates and edits to the regional REMAC policies so that all EMS providers will be able to participate and the REMAC members can work on any changes in a cooperative fashion.
- There is a BLS IM Glucagon Regional Pilot Program that was presented by Chief Takamine from Flanders and approved by the REMAC to be sent to the State Council Med Standards and SEMAC Committees for discussion in December. This will allow a Basic EMT to administer IM Glucagon to a patient with a low blood sugar. Thank you Chief Takamine for his work on this proposal.
- Last, the next scheduled meeting of the Suffolk County RTAC is next Wednesday, November 20th at 2:30 pm here in the County Offices in Yaphank.
- Ms. Wayrich reported the following on Program Agency:
 - Please note updates to the Suffolk REMSCO website:
 - All virtual as well as any in-person classes in Nassau and Suffolk Counties will now be posted on the on the Suffolk REMSCO website under CME.
 - NEMSIS 3.5 update
 - Non-Direct entry users must contact their vendors to assist in rectifying any problems. Our direct entry users, please email epcr@suffolkcountyny.gov with any issues, questions, comments, or concerns. We have weekly meetings with our ImageTrend account advisor and monthly meetings with all our direct entry users.
 - We have identified some common validation failures and will be placing educational documents in the resources tab of the ImageTrend Elite website to assist our Direct Entry users in correcting the mistakes so we can re-trigger to NYS for them.
 - NYS BEMSATS has asked the Program Agencies to reach out to the Agencies in their counties that they have identified as having ZERO submissions to NYS in any given quarter between 2022Q1 and 2024Q3 and have them work with their vendors to rectify this issue. In Suffolk County that is appx. 30 Agencies. We have completed this task and are looking forward to an update from NYS sometime in the next week or two to make sure the Agencies are handling this with their vendors.
 - On behalf of NYS EMS, and commensurate with the contractual and legal obligations of the REMSCO, REMAC and Program Agency under NYS Law, I will be forwarding you all the latest NEMSIS 3.5 ePCR report auto generated by NYS EMS.
 - Weekly ePCR reports:
 - “Validation failures by account”- listing of actual failed fields by vendor and field type
 - “Monitoring Packet”- number of charts correctly received for the listed time period- listed by agency. Compare the number of charts listed to your agencies call volume for the same time and assure that no charts are missing.
 - If the numbers do not reconcile, please contact your ePCR vendor to see why their charts are not being sent or are not validating correctly.
 - From the BEMSATS
 - As the licensure branch grows, they will be creating one portal with a drop-down menu for all things ex. Ambulance renewals, CLEA, CON, etc.
 - Vital Signs 2025 11.11.25-11.15.25, will have info on NYS website early 2025.
 - REMSCO Trauma Lifesaving Award
 - A draft of a REMSCO Trauma Lifesaving Award was created and sent to all with the last meeting reminder. As of today, we have not received any feedback. It will be brought to the next RTAC meeting for discussion, and if there are no changes recommended, we would like to go forward with this beginning January 1st, 2025.
 - Program Agencies will meet live in person at State Council in three weeks.

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- Mr. Masterton reported the following on Education and training:
 - **Education** – EMS Courses – The Suffolk County EMS Divisions completed a EMTB Refresher Course in November with most of Students already taking the NYS written. We look forward to all of them joining our EMS system in the coming weeks. Our EMTB Refresher Course being held at the “new” Islip’s Exchange Ambulance Building will be finishing up in December 2024. We also have just completed our second NYS Instructor Update and CEU for 2024. The certificates were emailed out to the instructors earlier today. Thank you to Chief, Kevin Lynch from the NYS Bureau of EMS Education for your presentation on the recent NYS Education Updates and to all the Regional Faculty Members that participated. It was well received with over 40 Instructors attending.
 - Our two new Eastern Suffolk BOCES EMTB Original Courses are going well, and they will be starting their clinical time on ambulances just after Christmas this year. This program will be a great opportunity for EMS Agency Junior Members in High School to become EMT’s during school hours. Students will need to turn 17 y/o by June 30th of the school year. They must also be a “Junior Member” of an EMS Agency in the Eastern Suffolk BOCES school districts. The school districts included in the ES BOCES Program are Islip, Brookhaven, Riverhead, Southold, Southampton, East Hampton and the Southern part of Smithtown. Registration will be through the school district like the other BOCES Programs.
 - The SCEMS Division is also currently running an evening Juniors EMT Original Course at the Community Ambulance and one at St. Anthony’s High School.
 - We have several EMTB Originals courses running throughout Suffolk County (West Babylon FD, Ronkonkoma FD, Brentwood Ambulance, Riverhead Ambulance and Southampton Town Ambulance. We will be posting sometime later this week several more EMT Originals Courses starting in January/February (Bay Shore, North Babylon and Yaphank.) Yaphank will be “synchronous” with the Fishers Island FD. We will also be starting a “Rapid” Daytime EMT Original (M,W,F) at the SCEMS Academy. We are also working on another EMT Refresher and a CFR Original for early 2025. Please note that all of the EMS Courses that are being offered in Suffolk County are posted on the Suffolk REMSCO website under the “Training Courses” tab. <https://www.suffolkremSCO.com/main/training-education/> You can also sign up on the website for email course announcement.

 - **ABC Courses** – The SCEMS Division is resuming our Hybrid ACLS and Hybrid PALS classes. Currently we have a Hybrid ACLS Refresher posted for November/December. Students must attend one of the skills dates (11/20, 11/21, 12/18 or 12/19/24.) We will be posting more Hybrid ACLS and PALS Courses for early 2025 shortly. Please check the Training Courses tab “AHA Courses” page for listings and registration information.  - **CME** –We have recently completed the ALS Core CME Online Beta Test and we would like to thank all the providers that have completed the Beta course on time and for assisted us with your comments and concerns. Your assistance has defiantly helped to improve to courses.
 - Also a special thank you to our newest EMS Officer, Clayton DeCosterd and Infrastructure Solutions Inc. for their work in helping me with completing the all the “IT” work and settings needed for the ALS CME Online Courses to be published. Thank You!
 - The New ALS CME was posted on the E-Learning Website today and we will be setting up a CME Coordinator Update Teams Meetings with the agenda of onboarding and registering EMT-CC’s and EMTP’s onto the New Online ALS CME Courses. We will also be adding additional BLS Online CME Lessons for the BLS Providers that have completed the online BLS CME Course.
 - 2025 Monthly CME Schedule; With the steady increase in the number of students taking the online CME the Monthly CME Schedule for 2025 will be changing. We have removed the ALS for Dix Hills and the BLS for Yaphank. We have also changed the ALS Yaphank and the Dix Hills BLS to every other month. The Monthly CME Classes for 2025 are posted with a few more being added later this week.
 - Just a reminder that Providers in the Suffolk County EMS Division CME Program are required to meet with their Agency CME Coordinator to review the paperwork and then make an appointment with the EMS Division to submit their packet CME Packet. We suggest a timeline at least ninety (90) days prior

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their certification expiration. Forty-Five Day Late Form, you will not be allowed to schedule an appointment with the Suffolk County EMS Division under sixty (60) days of certification expiration without a 45 day form signed by the Authorized EMS Agency Officer. Question on CME should first be directed to your Agency CME Coordinator.

- The Suffolk County EMS Division is working on a “New” two-three (2-3) hour Non-Core CME (De Escalation technics with a skills demo review on restraints for Behavioral Emergencies.) We plan on offering these trainings in each of the Ten (10) Towns later this winter and spring. Please look for postings for this new class.
- **Update on Bridge Program** –The SCEMS Division currently has no students registered for Cohort # 11 that tests out December/January. We currently do have seven (7) students registered in Cohort #12 that finish in May/June 2025. Cohort #13 started in October of 2024 and it will run through January of 2026. Registration will open up on January 2nd 2025 with applications due by March 28th 2025 for the next course running April 17th 2025 through July 16th 2026. Please check the bottom of the “Training Courses” page for a link to the Northwell EMT-CC to Medic Bridge Course. The final EMT-CC to Paramedic Bridge shall commence in April of 2026. We continue to advise our current EMT-CCs to strongly pursue the Bridge Program while it exists. Also funding is available to EMS Agencies to offset the cost to the provider. - **NYS Education Regulations:**
- The Part 800-Emergency Medical Services Personnel (800.6-800.20) were updated and posted on the NYS BEMS&T website effective 6/05/2024. Includes (A candidate's initial certification shall expire at 11:59
- p.m. on the last day of the month **48 months** following the month in which the candidate passed the cognitive certification examination.) Anyone with August 2024 expiration and refreshed will have 48 months to renew. Also anyone whose end of course was in July of 2024 will have an expiration of August of 2028. Going forward all will be 48 months. Providers that took the NYS Exam or refreshed before July 2024 will have 36 months.

Education and Training- W.M. Masterton

- A Course Sponsor application has been received, and two more are expected. REMSCO is expected to make a recommendation to the state.
- A special Training and Education Subcommittee meeting to discuss the course sponsor application for Bloodborne Pathogens was scheduled for November 19, 2024, at 6 PM at Suffolk County EMS.

Resource Needs- E. Boyd

- No applications, nothing to report.

Communications and Technology- J. Atkinson

- Mr. Atkinson is excused, no report given.

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Nominations Committee – S. Slovensky (excused, given by S. Edouard)

- Mr. Slovensky reported that letters for renewal were received from the following agencies for the following representatives:

- Mr. Slovensky made a motion to accept the seat renewals, which was seconded by Dr. Acosta, and passed without opposition.
- Mr. Slovensky further reported that he has a letter from member Phillip Cammann stating that he will be stepping down as a representative for the East End Ambulance Coalition. Ms. Kaitlyn Hand will be the new representative for the organization. Mr. Slovensky made a motion to accept the new representative, seconded by Dr. Winslow, and passed without opposition.
- Mr. Slovensky reported that Suffolk County Community College did not meet the attendance requirements for the past two years, but he recommends they remain a member provided they meet the requirements in 2025. Mr. Slovensky made a motion as such. Mr. Cammann seconded the motion, and it passed without opposition.
- Mr. Slovensky received a letter from Islip Ambulance Chiefs that they no longer wish to maintain a seat on REMSCO. Additionally, REMSCO received two letters- from AMR and Port Jefferson Ambulance- asking for membership to REMSCO. There was some discussion, and a question as to whether the form was simply filled out incorrectly. The discussion was tabled to a future meeting, pending clarification.
- Mr. Slovensky reported that he received nominations for the executive board; Ed Boyd, Esq. for Chair, Mark Zender, PA-C for Vicechair, and Thomas Prendergast for Treasurer. He then opened the floor for additional nominations; none were made. Mr. Slovensky made a motion to accept the slate, seconded by Mr. Cammann, and passed without opposition.

Performance Improvement – B. Talmage

- Mr. Talmage reported that he is waiting on the state and has nothing further to report.

REMAC – Dr. Acosta

- Dr. Acosta reported that this is his last meeting as REMAC Chair, and elections will be held later this month. He thanked REMSCO for their support.
- Dr. Marshall reported that the Policy Manual was updated, including the RMA section and many educational documents were removed, streamlining the manual.
- Dr. Marshall reported that discussion continues on the use of prehospital blood at the subcommittee level.
- Dr. Winslow reminded the group that BLS Igel Applications are once again being accepted by HVREMSCO. Please contact Secretary Hannigan if any agency is interested. Dr. Marshall reported that discussions on protocol continue at the state level, and it is possible that we will see BLS Igel added in the next update “if trained and equipped.”
- Mr. Manzi asked about the status of the Policy Manual, as he has gotten some questions. Dr. Marshall reported that the questions that were brought forward regarding changes the REMSCO made in 2022, and that the new update did not pertain to the sections that were being questioned. Items that changed referenced the RMA policy, changed individual people’s names to just their titles, changes to bring the manual in line with the collaborative protocols, and minor formatting issues. Additionally, the level of AEMT was recognized in Suffolk County, effective immediately.

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- Mr. Manzi asked when the AEMT course might be offered, and Chief Masterton stated that he has not yet looked into it. Dr. Winslow reported that he has reached out to Don Hudson (who currently runs AEMT classes) for guidance with developing a course for Suffolk County. Dr. Winslow reported that he will make it a project for 2025. Any current AEMTs in the area can contact their agency medical director to provide care at that level for their agency.

Legislative – R. Franz

- Mr. Franz reported that the Direct Payment law goes into effect on January 1, 2025. Ambulance providers will receive direct payment for services upon submission of a claim to the patient's insurance company without the ambulance company needing to be a "preferred or participating provider" with the insurance company.
- Various Fire and EMS organizations are finalizing their 2025 legislative agenda. A few items included on their agendas are designating EMS as an essential service, increase the volunteer firefighters and ambulance workers personal income tax credit and increase the ambulance service Medicaid rate. Legislative bills from the 2024 session will have to be reintroduced in the 2025 session and new legislative sponsors will be needed for some of the bills

Bylaws- A. Pellicone

- Mr. Pellicone was excused, Mr. Smith reported that Mr. Pellicone will bring forward the proposed changes to the bylaws at the next meeting. These changes were already emailed to the membership for their review.

Public Information- P. Cammann

- Mr. Manzi again thanked all involved with the recent CPR Save Awards.
- Mr. Manzi mentioned that REMSCO needs an additional backdrop and larger tablecloths for awards ceremonies and the annual conference. Mr. Manzi made a motion to approve funding to purchase one additional backdrop and two additional tablecloths. The motion was seconded by Mr. Miniutti and passed without opposition.
- Mr. Manzi requested a thank you letter sent to Coram FD, as they hosted the CPR Awards Ceremony and supplied breakfast. One will be sent out tomorrow.

New Business

- Mr. Marra reported that AMR has offered to assist with bariatric transport. Currently the county has Copiague, Brentwood and Flanders. This will be in addition to and a backup to those agencies. Mr. Marra asks for REMSCO's permission to move forward on an MOU with AMR for response within the county. The particulars of this MOU are still being discussed. This support was given, and Mr. Marra will keep REMSCO updated on progress.
- A motion was made by Mr. Cammann to continue retaining Mr. Timothy Glynn as the Suffolk REMSCO Legal Counsel, to continue using J. P. Morgan/Chase Bank as the Suffolk REMSCO financial institution, and to continue using Newsday as the official publication of the Suffolk REMSCO. This was seconded by Dr. Acosta and passed without opposition.
- The next meeting of Suffolk County REMSCO will be on January 14, 2025, at 7 PM at Suffolk County EMS. The remainder of the meetings for 2025 will be determined at that meeting. Mr. Manzi thanked REMSCO for their support and wished the new board well.

There being no further business to come before the council, a motion to adjourn was made by Dr. Acosta, seconded by Mr. Diffley, at 2006 hrs.
